

About the Institute:

Six Trait writing builds on the foundation of writing process by helping teachers and students better understand what writers do when they revise. The traits provide teachers with three key ingredients to assist in their teaching of writing:

- **a common language with which to discuss writing,**
- **a reasonably consistent and objective method to assess student writing, and**
- **a gateway into revision.**

The traits of ideas, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency and conventions form the backbone of writing, and the traits provide a method for teaching those concepts.

During the workshop, the teachers will learn about each trait, what each one “looks like” in literature, how to create lessons teaching the trait and how to assess student writing in each trait. Teachers will also write and begin to assess the strength of their own writing on a trait-by-trait basis.

About the Presenter:

Fred Wolff

Fred Wolff has been a classroom teacher for 19 of his 24 years in public education. One of the original teachers to become involved in the New Hampshire Writing Project in 1979, he has directed a number of published anthologies of student writing. In 1992 he was awarded a Distinguished Teacher Award from the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars. In 1997 he received a Fulbright Scholarship to study education in Japan. Most recently, he produced and wrote the script for Telling Their Stories, an hour long documentary aired on PBS about holocaust survivors living in New Hampshire. In addition to teaching writing to students from third grade through high school, Fred helped launch the Student Writers Academy at the University of New Hampshire where he has taught numerous courses in the Education Department. He holds a doctorate in Curriculum and Teaching from Boston University.
